REMEMBER**

When our caretaker Ishwori and her son got into a serious road accident last month, we felt upset and worried. We never expected something good could come out of the incident.

While staying at the hospital, Ishwori continued to be concerned about stray dogs. From her window on the fifth floor she noticed a mother dog with three puppies. She worried about them at night, when the temperatures dropped considerably.

When one of the puppies died and the mother dog carried the dead body across the hospital compound, Ishwori called us. We rescued the dog, now named Ganga, and her two surviving puppies.

The same evening a bag with five small puppies was found by a volunteer along the river bank. He took them to our shelter.

We were convinced they could not survive without mother, and tried adding them to Ganga's litter. To our delight, Ganga accepted the puppies as her own. She did the same with two other motherless puppies.

The story of Ishwori and Ganga is a symbol for the compassion and generousness which we often come across.

May Christmas and the New Year be filled with such stories of hope and dedication.
