



Rescue Mission Stray Cows

Even though the cow is considered holy in Nepal, stray cows suffer tremendously, especially in the cities.

Abandoned calves rummage through garbage, weak with malnutrition and dehydration, panting heavily.

Old cows can be found sleeping on the hot tarmac, their stomach sunken in and ribs showing, hardly raising its head when cars swirl around their exhausted bodies.

Animal Nepal is not really equipped to treat stray cows but when there is no other alternative we try to help.

Last week we rescued Maiti, who was hit by a car and suffered a broken front leg.

Our vets plastered Maiti's leg and developed a simple support system, allowing the injured calf to stand up every three hours.

Maiti is recovering fast and feels at home at our Animal Sanctuary.
